

Good Evening and Welcome to our first Convocation Ceremony.

Three years ago, Jio Institute was born under the guidance and with the blessings of our Chairman Sh. Mukesh Ambani ji and our Chairperson, Smt. Nita Ambani ji, with a bold vision - to become a world-class institution of learning, innovation, and sustainable progress for Bharat and the world.

Today, as we reflect on our journey, I feel humbled, grateful, and proud of the remarkable achievements of the Institute in such a short span.

Our foundation is built on academic excellence, holistic education, industry relevance, and societal impact. We currently offer cutting-edge programs in Artificial Intelligence & Data Science, Management, and Sports Management, supported by top-tier faculty and world-class facilities.

We have achieved remarkable academic growth

- In the past three years, we have graduated 319 students across the three programs: 143 in AI&DS, 142 in Management, and 34 in Sports Management. These students have come from 26 states of India and four countries South Africa, Nepal, Bhutan and Gana.
- Applications for admission to Jio Institute have increased from 455 in our the first year to 1,800 today.

These students have been supported by world class faculty and Industry leaders

- Our faculty pool comprises of over 100 thought leaders, half of which have come
 from international universities such as Northwestern University, University of
 Illinois at Urbana Champaign, University of Houston, Pace University, Deakin
 University, Georgia University, and UCSB, University of South Carolina etc. The
 remaining faculty come from global corporations such as Microsoft, Google, Fractal,
 Sales Force, Nissan, Allen Institute for AI, Inception Institute of AI PwC, Deloitte,
 etc.
- We have delivered more than 90 courses per year across all three programs and more than 150 industry experts have engaged with our students in this period.
- Our global immersion program has taken our students to Universities such as the Nanyang Technological University in Singapore and Hamad Bin Khalifa University in Qatar for an enriching academic, startup, industrial, and cultural experience.

Jio Institute faculty have achieved remarkable milestones in Research

- Our faculty have published More than 30 research papers in top-tier journals including the prestigious Nature and IEEE Transactions, and presented at top tier national and international conferences like CVPR MICCAI, ICCV, WACV, etc.
- Our faculty have laid strong foundations in establishing cutting-edge research labs in Artificial Intelligence, Computer Vision Medical Imaging, Semiconductor Materials, Cancer Metabolism, and Microbiota Therapeutics.

Our Students have received Remarkable Placements

- Over 300 organizations have partnered with Jio Institute. With the tireless efforts of our placement team, we have achieved over 85% placement rate across the last three years. We aim to achieve 100% placement rate in the coming years.
- This year alone, our students have interned with Over 50 companies offered projects in the Retail & E-Commerce, Media & Entertainment, Consulting, Sports and other industries.

We have connected with 150 new companies outside Reliance group. Over 30 organizations hird students from our batch

Distinguished guests and my faculty colleagues. I was just reflecting on this occasion; and just seeing that the most distinguished guests we have with us today: Dr. Mashelkar, Ms. Arundhati, and Mr. Jala Dani: What made this happen?

I go back to my personal life. When I became a student, when we were taught chemistry, our teacher used to mention a name Dr. Mashelkar with National Chemicals Lab. When I joined my job, I did a project for CSIR, and somebody told me that the Director General of CSIR, is Dr. Mashelkar. In 1979, my first job after graduation, was with State Bank of India (SBI). In 1978, SBI opened a local head office in Guwahati. Before that, we used to come under the jurisdiction of Kolkata. I never thought, a day would come that I would be sitting next to the ex-Chairperson of SBI, and that, I would be blessed with Dr. Mashelkar's insight

In 1981, when I was a Professor of Management at Guwahati University, a Professor presented a case study on Asian Paints. I never thought a day would come, when I would have the privilege of being with the promoter of Asian Paints.

With three distinguished people here, and a person who studied in Hindi Rashtriya Vidyalaya in Tezpur, what made this happen? I tell you what made this happen. The first is: Indian parents' commitment to education, they will sacrifice everything, but make sure the children gets the best education. The second thing I felt very important is our Indian values, and the commitment of teachers to give the children the best education. I ask you to carry with you the mindset of the pole vaulter-not content with jumping over hurdles, but determined to soar above them. In an era of disruption, the champions will not be those who walk along well-worn paths, but those who dare to imagine new ones.

Remember, the world does not need more followers. It needs pathbreakers, dreamers, doers and disruptors.

We stand at the precipice of a technological revolution that will reshape our world in ways we cannot imagine.

Remember, every disruption in history started with one bold mind refusing to accept limits. The world is waiting for India's DeepSeek moment, India's global breakthroughs, and it is waiting for you to make them happen!

And as you set out on this journey, I want you to carry with you the five Mashelkar Mantras-principles that have guided my own journey, and ones that I know will propel you to greatness:

Mashelkar Mantra #1

Keep your aspirations high. They are your possibilities.

At the age of eight, Gukesh said his aspiration was to be the youngest-ever world champion in Chess. And he made a billion Indians proud by becoming one.

Mashelkar Mantra #2

You can do anything, but not everything. So focus.

As Swami Vivekananda once said, "Take up one idea. Make that one idea your life - think of it, dream of it, live on that idea. Let the brain, muscles, nerves, every part of your body, be full of that idea, and just leave every other idea alone. This is the way to success."

Mashelkar Mantra #3

Purpose, perseverance, and passion matter.

Talent and intelligence will get you started, but only grit and resilience will take you to the finish line. "Winners never quit, and quitters never win." Stay hungry, stay relentless.

Mashelkar Mantra #4

If the doors that you keep on knocking on don't open, create your own doors.

You will face rejection, you will hit roadblocks, but never let someone else's "no" define your journey. Innovators don't wait for opportunities; they create them. Be a creator, not just a consumer.

Mashelkar Mantra #5

There is no limit to human endurance. No limit to human achievement. Except the limits that you put on yourself.

Just look at the events in the last few weeks.

Look at 18th March. Sunita Williams, returned to earth on that day after spending a record 322 days in space. She stretched the extremeties of human endurance by battling the vast loneliness of space, isolation, distance and time itself.

Look at 20th January 2025. China's announced its AI model, DeepSeek-R1. It achieved something that was considered impossible - ultra-affordable Generative AI.

DeepSeek erased over \$1 trillion in market capitalization of top American deep tech leaders within days, a global record. But most importantly, DeepSeek's disruptive innovations dramatically reshaped the global balance of power in technology, economics, and national security.

So remember, every record broken, every frontier conquered, every invention that changed the world started with someone who refused to believe in limits. You can be that someone if you go limitless.

Professor Mashelkar, Chancellor of Jio Institute, Dr. Dipak Jain, Vice-Chancellor, dignitaries on the dais and the graduating students, parents, faculty, staff and other guests present here today: first of all, a heartfelt thank you to Jio Institute for inviting me for this very signal event. This is the first ever convocation of an institute which I know will one day be world beating, because of the very way that it has been conceived.

The vision that Shri Mukesh Ambani and Smt. Nita Ambani had of creating an institute, that is something that will create a global benchmark, has begun to take shape. And you the first three batches, you are the ones who will be the flag bearers of the same. I know when we come to give a convocation address, you are supposed to tell certain things to this graduating students that will help them in their life going forward.

It's difficult to do that after what Dr. Mashelkar has already told you. He's covered almost every single mantra there is, and if you can remember all of those, I know that you all will be very successful in life. But even then, to do my duty, let me tell you a story or two about what you can do in order to ensure that you make a place for yourself in this very uncertain world, but a world that is full of possibilities.

Going back to the story, there was a time; and this is a story from the Mahabharata, one of our epics, which is a storehouse of knowledge. In this, Narada, who is supposed to be the messenger of the gods, asks Shri Vishnu that why is it that Yudhistir, whose also a person who always gives a lot of things to whoever asks for, is not called Daata Yudhistir, but it is Karna who is known as Daata Karna. Why is this the case?

And Vishnu said: "come let's go there and I will show you why". So, they took the disguise of two mendicant and they go to Raja Yudhistir. They had still got his kingdom at that time. And they say, that our father has passed away, we are poor Brahmins.

His last wish was that he should be cremated on a pyre of sandalwood. This was the month of Shravana (monsoons) and it was raining everywhere. So Yudhistir said, your wish is my command, I will give you the sandalwood that you desire, please rest. He sent his people all over the place.

The people came back after three days and said, we are sorry, we can't find a single piece of dry sandalwood. We are not able to bring it. Yudhistir comes and apologizes to these mendicants: "We are really, really sorry, but we can't find dry sandalwood to give to you. Vishnu and Narada make their way to Karna.

They repeat the same request and Karna does the same. He sends his people all over the place, and three days later, it's the same result. His people come back and tell him, it's not available. Such wood is not available right now. It's raining so hard. Karna sits and thinks and then he says: "take down all the windows and doors of my house. They are all made of sandalwood and give those to these mendicants, because that is dry." And when they leave from there, Vishnu turns around and tells Narada: "now you know why he is called Daata Karna."

The reason why I tell this story is whatever is the job given to you, learn to excel at it. Learn to think out of the box. Learn to really be such, that you can be relied upon to do something which will actually give the solution. If you can do that, you will not have any competition. Your space, in whichever space you wish to be, will be completely assured.

Let me now tell you just the second story and I will end with that one. The second story is of a coach. This is an interesting Instagram Reel that was sent to me by one of my colleagues, and I liked it very much, so I am repeating it to you. It is about the coach who is asked by a young girl who wants to run the 100-meter race to coach her, and he takes her on.

He coaches her for three to four months and then the first race occurs. There are eight participants in the race. This girl is also there. They run the race and she is very sad because she comes in last, and she comes to the coach and she says, "I'm sorry I failed you". And the coach says, "no you haven't." The girl asks, "how is that so?"

He says, "I had you down for 19 seconds. I had you down for breaking the 20 second barrier. You actually ran the race in 18 seconds. Do you realize that this is your career best? You may have lost in respect to others, but in respect to yourself, this is the best that you have done in your entire career, so actually, you've won this race."

The girl looks up and says, "that's true. I've never run this in 18 seconds. Tomorrow I'm going to do better." And that's exactly what you all need to do; every single day that you wake up, be a better version of yourself. It doesn't matter if it is by 0.01 seconds, but if you continue to improve on a regular basis, you can then actually realize your full potential.

So that is what I will leave you with. Excel in what you do, become better every single day, and last but not the least is something that's been told to you by all your teachers, by your Chancellor, by everybody who's come here: Be a lifelong learner. The only way that you are going to make your place in this world, the only way you're going to make a mark, the only way when you come to my age and look back at your life and wonder whether you have lived it well; is if you become a constant learner.
